ILLNESS PROCEDURES

For the protection of all children in school, your child must be kept home if he/she has any of the following symptoms or illness.

If symptoms or illness appear while your child is at school, a parent will be called to take the child home. **THE EMERGENCY CONTACT PERSON WILL BE CALLED TO PICK UP THE CHILD IF THE PARENT CANNOT BE REACHED.**

ILLNESS DEFINED

- Temperature over 100 degrees orally.
(If your child is sent home with a fever, we will not expect to see your child the next day.)
- Diarrhea and/or vomiting
- Undiagnosed rash with fever
- Red eyes, with discharge
- Head lice, ringworm or scabies
- Profuse nasal discharge
- Cough with excess sputum
- Strep infection
- Chickenpox
- Listless, out of sorts, unable to participate

EXCLUDE UNTIL

- Fever and Tylenol free for 24 hours.
- 24 hours since last vomiting or diarrhea.
- After doctor diagnoses rash, not contagious/fever gone without medication administered.
- If diagnosed pink eye needs 24 hours of prescription medication.
- After treatment protocol.
- Until no longer contagious/no longer profuse nasal discharge or cough.
- Until treated for 24 hours with antibiotic.
- Until all pox are dry and scabbed over, 3-7 days.
- When normal daily activity and normal behavior resumes in classroom.

If your child is exposed to one of the following infectious diseases, IT MUST BE REPORTED TO THE SCHOOL IMMEDIATELY AFTER DIAGNOSED BY A MEDICAL PROVIDER.
