PEACE SITE

Rice Lake has been a dedicated International Peace Site since 1998.

PERSONNEL

- 35 licensed teachers (20 classroom teachers and 15 specialists/special education teachers)
- 38 support staff (instructional, special ed and computer paraprofessionals, secretaries/clerks, health office, interpreters)
- 4 Kids Club site managers, 2 assistant managers and 4 part-time assistants
- 4 custodians (4 FTE)
- 5 food service employees

CHARACTERISTICS OF POPULATION

- 6% free and reduced lunch
- 17% eligible for special education

SPECIAL EDUCATION

- Serve 95 students with learning disabilities, emotional behavioral problems, speech/language impaired, physical/hearing/visual impaired, cognitive delays and/or autism who reside in our attendance area
- Provide district-wide program for 8 students with developmental cognitive abilities

KIDS CLUB

- Provide before and after school child care for 118 children , 101 families (6 a.m. to 6 p.m.)
- Provide afternoon kindergarten extension for 5 children
- Preschool and childcare for 4-year olds
 - Provide childcare full day and half day for 41 children, 39 families (9:30 am – 4 pm)

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

- **CERF:** Locally funded program supporting 76 students in reading (13% of student population)
- **Compass:** Non-special ed intervention program for students who need social support provide services for 60 students
- **Gifted Education Program:** Provides services to students, teachers and parents in grades K-5.
- **Mentor Program:** Matches up 30 students with 30 staff, parent volunteers, or community members
- **Extraordinary Parent Volunteer Program:** 517 volunteers provide 8,296 hours of service with children at school

MULTIPURPOSE ROOMS

- Provide small group instruction for early reading and math interventions and accelerated reading programs
- Provide space for mentoring
- Provide space to conduct large group activities
- Provide a space for a motor room to assist children in developing integrated sensory motor function

SPECIALTY PROGRAMS

- Wireless Pilot of portable computers – grades 1-5
- Residencies in art and writing
